Changes in community structures, particularly due to migration and diaspora, highlight the evolving dynamics of cultural identity and adaptation to multicultural environments. This study addresses existing gaps by providing a holistic analysis that combines local wisdom with global dynamics, emphasizing the crucial role of character-based educational leadership in managing these changes. The research contributes theoretically by offering a new analytical framework and practically by providing strategies for cultural adaptation and preservation, thereby guiding Hindu communities in maintaining their identities in the global era.

Hindu religion and culture, as well as how Hindu communities navigate these changes (Fandir, 2024; Jacob et al., 2015; Nweke & Okpaleke, 2019; Rosenmann et al., 2016).

Recent research on the influence of globalization on Hindu religious practices and cultural expressions has revealed various significant changes. The absence of studies that combine local wisdom perspectives with globalization analysis also constitutes a gap that needs to be filled to gain a more complete understanding of this phenomenon.

Filling this research gap is essential to provide deeper insights into how Hindu communities can maintain their cultural and spiritual identities amidst the currents of globalization. This study is expected to contribute theoretically by developing an analytical framework that integrates Hindu local wisdom with the dynamics of globalization. Additionally, practically, the findings of this research can offer recommendations for Hindu community leaders in formulating effective strategies to manage change and promote the sustainability of their cultural and religious practices.

The aspiration of this research is to uncover how globalization specifically influences various aspects of Hindu religious practices and cultural expressions, as well as how Hindu communities respond and adapt to these changes. This study also aims to identify factors that support or hinder cultural and religious adaptation in the context of globalization. Thus, this research will not only add to the existing literature but also provide practical guidance for stakeholders in preserving and developing Hindu cultural heritage in the global era.

Data verification was conducted through source triangulation and re-examination of the utilized literature to ensure the validity and accuracy of the research findings. The research procedure encompassed problem formulation, data collection, data analysis, interpretation of findings, and the compilation of a comprehensive research report. To ensure validity and reliability, this study employed data source triangulation and thorough verification processes, despite limitations in the scope of literature and potential biases in source selection. Consequently, this research is expected to provide an in-depth understanding of the influence of globalization on Hindu religious practices and cultural expressions, as well as how Hindu communities navigate these changes to maintain their cultural and spiritual identities.

This observation is consistent with Abdulla (2023) findings, which noted the evolution of Hindu art in the global

The integration of technology into religious practices is another theme highlighted in this study. The use of mobile applications for ritual management, streaming of religious services, and the utilization of augmented reality technology in Hindu art exhibitions demonstrate how technology can enhance participation and religious experiences. This research extends the insights provided by Maulana (2022) by offering concrete examples of how technology is employed to sustain and disseminate religious practices in the digital age.

Changes in the structure of Hindu communities are also identified as a consequence of globalization. The study reveals that migration and Hindu diaspora result in shifts in leadership dynamics and community organization, with increased cross-cultural and international collaboration. This supports Reddy et al. (2022) study, which highlights the structural changes in Hindu communities outside India. However, this research provides a more in-depth analysis of how these structural changes affect religious practices and cultural identity.

The dynamics of cultural identity emerge as a crucial focus in this study. Globalization poses challenges in maintaining authentic Hindu cultural identities amidst a homogenizing global flow. The research demonstrates that Hindu communities respond to these challenges by developing innovative adaptation strategies, such as preserving traditions through education and promoting local culture. These findings complement Mudzhar (2017) research, which emphasizes the importance of cultural education in maintaining Hindu identity, while adding perspectives on broader and multifaceted adaptation strategies.

The novelty of this research lies in its holistic approach that integrates various dimensions of globalization's impact on Hindu religious practices and cultural expressions. Thus, this study not only confirms previous findings but also expands the understanding of how various aspects of Hindu life are interconnected in the context of globalization.

This research also highlights regional differences in the influence of globalization on Hindu communities. Findings indicate that the impact of globalization varies depending on local contexts and the level of community openness to change. For instance, Hindu communities in India may experience different adaptations compared to Hindu diaspora in the West, demonstrating variations in responses to globalization. This adds a new dimension to the study of globalization and Hindu culture by showing that local contexts play a crucial role in determining the forms of adaptation and change.

Finally, this study provides practical implications for Hindu community leaders and policymakers in formulating effective strategies to manage the impacts of globalization. Recommendations include developing robust cultural education programs, judiciously utilizing technology to enhance religious participation without compromising traditional values, and establishing cross-cultural collaborative networks to strengthen community solidarity.
